But we still don't know how it got to the scene of the crime and from whence it came. Al will present various lines of evidence to help solve some of the mystery, including the results of a recent isotopic analysis (done by Jim Sickman at UC-Riverside) on nitrate samples gathered by Santa Barbara Channelkeeper from around the watershed. Unfortunately, a smoking gun was not found. The argument will be more along the line of if "it looks like a duck, quacks like a duck, has feathers like a duck"
