Proponent – Willing to take project lead and/or be a grant applicant.

Champion – Strong advocate of project and willing to help advance the idea.

Tier 1 Projects/Programs					
All Tier 1 projects/programs have all of the following characteristics:					
a. Meet one or more Watershed Management Plan objectives,					
b. Are feasible,					
c. Have clear benefit, and					
d. Have stakeholder support.					
Tier 1C	Tier 1P	Tier 1N			
Tier 1 subcategories have the following additional characteristics:					
e. Build the Council's capacity and continuity	e. Have a project proponent	e. Do not have a project proponent			
f. Collaborative; serves the interests or mandates of more than one Council member					

**Tier 1C** (Council) projects/programs are those that are priorities for advancing the Council as an organization. The Council, as project proponent, will initiate or actively pursue this relatively small list of projects/programs over the next three years. These are projects/programs that emphasize the value of collaboration via the Council and offer the opportunity for the Council to achieve successes in the short term.

g. Low cost

h. Achievable within three years

**Tier 1P** (Proponent) projects/programs have a project proponent. Funding for these projects/programs will be pursued as funding opportunities present themselves. This tier also includes projects/programs the Council as an organization may pursue as project proponent, but these are not the highest priority, short-term projects.

**Tier 1N** (No proponent) projects/programs, though supported and feasible, do not yet have a project proponent so funding for these will not be actively pursued.

# Tier 2 Projects/Programs Tier 2 projects/programs have the following characteristics: a. Meet one or more Watershed Management Plan objective, and b. May or may not have a project proponent, and c. Have unknown feasibility, or d. Have unclear benefit, or e. Are controversial or have mixed stakeholder support, or f. Are lower priority

**Tier 2** projects/programs shall remain on the Master Archive of Projects and Programs as concepts, but are not yet ready to be solidly supported by the Council.
