		Water Markets	Dr. Fienup is the Executive Director of the Center for Economic Research & Forecasting at California Lutheran University. He also serves as Exchange Administrator for the Fox Canyon Water Market Pilot Program.
2	9:20- 9:50	Matthew Fienup, Ph.D. California Lutheran University	Beginning in early 2017, Fox Canyon Groundwater Management Agency, in Ventura County, created the first formal groundwater market of its kind in California. Created in response to the drought and new state-mandated cuts to groundwater use, the Fox Canyon Water Market is designed to incentive conservation and creation of new water supplies while giving water users flexibility in the face of uncertain supply. During his presentation, Dr. Fienup will give us an introduction to water markets, provide some insights regarding the water
			market happening right in our backyard, and the challenges that water markets might face.

5	10:15- 10:40	Ventura River Watershed Surface Water-Groundwater and Nutrient Transport Models – Study Plan Update and Geologic Analysis of Ventura River Watershed Kevin DeLano, Geologist State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB)	Kevin DeLano will update the Council on two items related to the State Water Resource Control Board's ongoing groundwater-surface water and nutrient transport modeling project. (1) In response to the Technical Advisory Committee and public comments on SWRCB's Draft Study Plan, SWRCB is revising its model development approach and amending our consulting contract to add additional work and funding. The new funding enables their team to model groundwater in bedrock aquifers, model Thomas Fire impacts on hydrology, and release memos on Scenarios and Sensitivity Analysis methodologies for TAC and public review. (2) State Water Board staff are soliciting comments for its Draft Geologic Analysis of the Ventura River Watershed. Kevin will introduce the geologic analysis to the Council and answer any questions.
